Dear Concord Resident:

Concord Public Works (CPW) - Engineering and Water & Sewer Divisions are pleased to report that MDR Construction of Tewksbury, MA (the "Contractor") has been contracted to replace and improve drinking water infrastructure and full road reconstruction of Silver Hill Road (Turning Mill Road to cul-de-sac) as part of the Silver Hill Road Neighborhood Infrastructure Improvement Project, Phase 2. The contractor is tentatively scheduled to mobilize the 2nd to 3rd week of October with work to begin shortly after. All work is planned to be complete by May 1st, 2026 with winter shutdown scheduled in-between.

Working hours during this project will be Monday-Friday 7:00 am-4:00 pm. While efforts will be made to minimize construction impacts within the neighborhood, the project will inevitably result in some local noise, dust, times with limited access to driveways, temporary staging of materials within the Town rights-of-way (ROW), and occasional water service interruption. Notification of any scheduled interruption of water service will be made at least 24 hours (minimum) in advance, either in-person or by door hanger notice distribution. In addition, vehicles such as private trash collection trucks, moving trucks, and landscape trucks may have difficulty accessing the road between 7:00 am and 4:00 pm, and residents may wish to contact any private service or delivery providers to arrange alternative options. Access for mail and delivery trucks, public school buses, and emergency vehicles will be maintained throughout construction.

The water and road improvements highlighted above represent the second of a two-phase improvement project.

Irrigation and underground dog fence system notice

Please be advised that during roadway work within the public ROW, sections of your private in-ground irrigation and dog fence system that may be in the ROW may unavoidably be damaged. While the contractor will be instructed to be mindful of private infrastructure (including in-ground irrigation and dog fence systems) which may have been inadvertently placed within the public ROW, neither the Contractor nor the Town can be held responsible for those damages. CPW recognizes that many residents and/or their landscaping contractor may not be aware of their exact property bounds. For those reasons, as a guideline CPW recommends homeowners take this opportunity to remove/relocate any portion of their irrigation and dog fence systems that is located within five (5') feet of the existing edge of pavement prior to the road work occurring in the upcoming construction season. Should damage occur during the construction work, the contractor's maximum responsibility

is to cap the broken irrigation line or sprinkler head to reduce water loss. Thank you for your cooperation and patience as we move forward on this important project.

In addition, Concord Public Works would like to call your attention to the Town’s Stormwater Management program. The purpose of this program is to reduce and ultimately eliminate contaminants from entering the Town’s rivers, ponds, wells, etc. Please scan the QR code, and learn what you, as a homeowner, can do to help the Town of Concord keep our waters clean, safe and enjoyable for future generations.
